Bachelor of Arts in Individualized Studies (BAIS) provides students with a unique opportunity to complete their degree in liberal arts combined with career-related specializations such as applied technology and business, applied technology and communications, business and communications, and hospitality and tourism management, to mention a few. Students may choose to pursue a single area of study in depth or design a program of study by combining liberal arts courses with career-related concentrations. The BAIS program, which is a 120 credit hour program, will provide greater flexibility for transfer credits (up to 90 credits) to prospective students with prior coursework.


